- Brexit micro-targeting,
- Neuralink AI brain-chip trials,
- the decades-long hunt for Matteo Messina Denaro
- with a conspiracy so plausible readers will sink into every page.

Only two people can stop the plan:

- Maria, an insider whose photographic memory makes her a living hard-drive,
- and **Boris**, the Sicilian detective she once betrayed to save him.
- Their dual POV propels a globe-trotting thriller that ricochets from Palermo catacombs to Dublin's Docklands, Vatican vaults and Japanese monasteries.

Think I Am Pilgrim meets The Night Agent, with the Da Vinci Code's fact-vs-fiction game pushed further.

Seven self-contained yearly arcs make the story franchise-ready for streaming; the Ark is an instant icon.

Timely, cinematic and scandal-baiting, *The Camp* is engineered to dominate shelves, translation lists and option desks alike.
