death, deep-fake smear campaign which erases his career and Maria moving into arms of his enemy.

**2018-2019 – The Pandemic Playbook.** Maria smuggles out slides revealing a profit-driven coronavirus scenario - lockdowns, fear marketing, vaccine monopolies - years before COVID-19 erupts. The pair reunite long enough to leak evidence, only to watch the cabal pivot faster than governments can react.

**2020 – End-game.** Covid-19 launches in Bergamo Italy in February 2020, as we remember. Boris runs against the clock to uncover who is behind it, with past friends and government agencies hunting him. Climax is back in Sicilian setting, for a final auction of the Ark. Fingerprints, pass-phrases and a dead man's thumb opens the briefcase. A single gunshot decides whether the world resets - or submits to perpetual elite rule.

The novel closes on a cliff-edge that begs for sequel or screen adaptation, positioning *The Camp* as a franchise-ready property.
